## CITY OF COSTA MESA PENSION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE MEETING \*MINUTES\* June 26, 2013

CALL TO ORDER	The meeting was called to order at 4:31 p.m. by Mr. Arthur.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES	A motion was made by Mr. Hutchins and seconded by Mr. Mora to approve the minutes of June 19, 2013. Upon a voice vote, the motion carried 7-0.
PUBLIC COMMENTS	There was no public comment at the beginning of the meeting.

COMMITTEE MEMBER COMMENT	Mr. Sesler informed the committee of recent reports in the Bay area of employee contributions being picked up by their employers. Mr. Mora began discussion of the recent article distributed to the POC regarding Pennsylvania's conversion to a 401K plan for new employees.
OLD BUSINESS	The bulk of the meeting was devoted to part two of the municipal bankruptcy presentation prepared by Mr. Kapko. The presentation covered parties involved in the bankruptcy process, legal treatment and standing of those parties, powers of the municipal debtor, the process of debt discharge, and ramifications from a filing. Questions following the presentation covered the seniority of claims, current bankruptcy proceedings in San Bernardino and Stockton, and the implications of new GASB rules on city finances.
NEW BUSINESS	No new items were discussed at the meeting.
OPEN DISCUSSION & FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS	Following the presentation, Mr. Arthur charged the committee to begin research into potential solutions to the city's unfunded obligations. The committee will begin reviewing potential increases to the city sales tax and parcel tax to close the funding gap. Mr. Arthur, Mr. Hutchins, and Mr. Taboada have agreed to begin research on tax options. The latest iteration of the expert question list is scheduled to be discussed at the July 10 <sup>th</sup> meeting. Trend analysis prepared by Mr. Warren will also be reviewed by POC members at the July 10 <sup>th</sup> meeting.
ADJOURNMENT	A motion was made by Mr. Kapko and seconded by Mr. Sesler to adjourn the meeting at 5:50 p.m.
